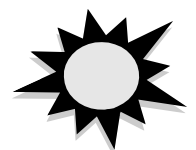

# HEAD INSTRUCTORS REPORT

Well this month starts our new training timetable. If you have any clashes due to training two dogs come and speak to me and we will see if we can sort it out. It will take a while to get used to the new class names but hopefully it's not too confusing!

It seems we are headed into the colder and wetter months of the year. If it is raining at 6.30pm we will be showing training dvd's in the club rooms, so please feel free to come along.

I thought I might try and give a brief outline about some common training techniques each month, this month is.....**Clicker training!**

Clicker training is a simple and effective method of training based on a positive reinforcement reward system. One of the best things about the clicker is the accuracy. The dog associates his action with the click and, subsequently, the reward. If your dog does not do what you are trying to teach, he will not get a click reward and so will try harder to do what you want to gain the reward. Not only does the dog better understand what he is doing, this also makes him more likely to repeat the action when asked in the future. Here's how you can easily train your dog to respond to the clicker :

- Begin with your dog in a quiet area.
- Have a handful of your dog's favourite treats ready.
- Press the clicker and immediately give your dog a treat. Repeat 5-10 times.
- You can test your success by clicking when your dog is not paying attention to you. If your dog responds to the click by suddenly looking at you, then looking for a treat, you are ready to move on.
- Next, begin teaching your dog commands eg sit or drop. At the *exact moment* your dog performs the desired action, press the clicker. Follow with a treat and praise.
- Once the dog understands what the clicker means you can use it as a tool in your agility training eg "Touch" dog goes to end of the contact and waits – click and reward.

**Clicker training can be very effective for advanced training.**

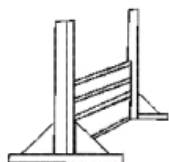
## *Some Advice*

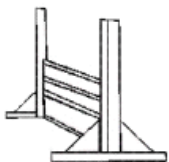

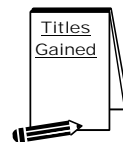

## What Do I Do Now !



### Joining Dogs SA:

When a member wishes to go trialing, it is compulsory to become a member of the organisation-Dogs SA. When joining Dogs SA you must also register your dog(s) that you wish to compete with. You can download an application form the Dogs SA website : [www.dogssa.com](http://www.dogssa.com) or they are also available from the desk.

Once you have joined, you will receive a monthly Dogs SA journal/magazine. The journal contains trial schedules for up and coming trial events. All schedules will contain the name of the host club, time & date, Judges, details of entry, payment and the closing date. The journal will also print trial results and title awards.

### Entering your first trial:

Providing you have joined Dogs SA, you can now enter trials. A dog can only start competing in agility from the age of 18 months (no earlier). One of the first things you will then need to do is arrange with the Dogs SA Agility Advisory Committee to get you dog measured to receive a height card for your dog and as long as your dog is 16 months or older you can get this done. Your dogs height card is for the life of your dog and should be taken to all trials you compete in.

**Q: Do you have any other pets?**

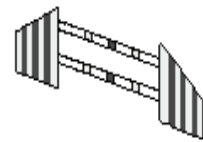
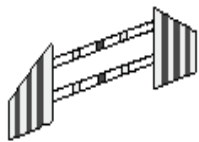
*A: Jeffrey as mentioned above, plus Gypsy the cat.*

# INSTRUCTIONS

## how to make your own bar jumps

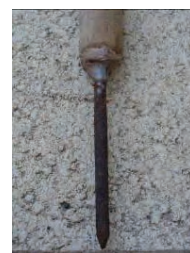


### It's Easy!

*Items to be purchased to make one jump:*

- 1 x Broom stick handle
- 1 x PVC Tee 20mm Cat 19
- Selleys liquid nails
- 2 x Bullet Head Nails (150mm x 5.60mm)
- 1.2m length of PVC pipe 20mm
- 4 x small screws

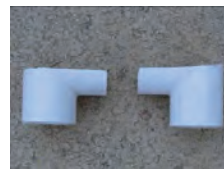
1. Measure broom stick and cut in half with saw
2. Measure and mark height (using pencil or texta) on each halve of broom stick e.g. 200mm, 300mm, 400mm, 500mm or 600mm depending on the height you want. If you want multiple heights then you need to purchase the appropriate number of tee's etc
3. Drill hole into the base of each broomstick halve
4. Cut heads off two nails using a grinder, saw or bolt cutters
5. Squeeze in liquid nails and insert nail into the base (as shown in figure 1), hold for a few minutes and then allow to dry, repeat for the base
6. Cut Tee in half as shown in figure (2) and (3) using a saw, sand the rough edges

7. Drill two holes in the side of each tee half
8. Screw each tee half to the broomstick at the required jump height, as shown in figures (4) and (5)



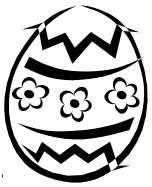

9. If you want, paint the uprights and poles then you're all done!

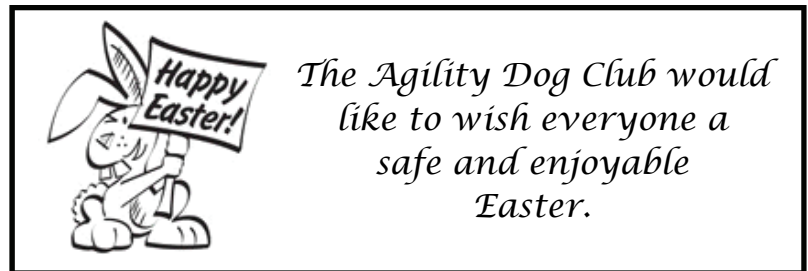




# Rules of Chocolate Easter Eggs...

Dog agility people have parents and family who think they've lost their minds, neighbours who think they're strange and doggy friends who think they're terrific!



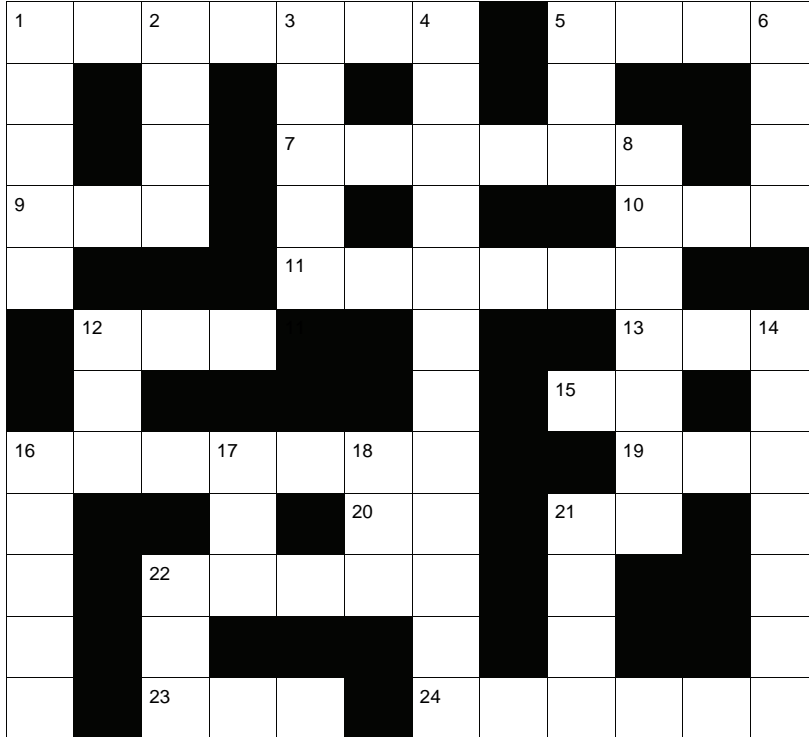

2. Bird opens its beak.
3. A black clump of grass appears next to the house.
4. The inside of the slipper box becomes black.
5. One of the flowers vanishes.
6. A reflection appears on the window of the door.
7. The house loses a brick.
8. The kennel name changes to Bozzo.
9. The man's striped tie changes to black.
10. A slipper shadow appears.
